<p><b>Reading</b> You can read:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book</li><li>- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections</li><li>- magazines, comics, newspapers</li><li>- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books</li></ul> <p><i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read so that you can claim your Reading Raffle Ticket.</i></p>	<p><b>Wonderful Writing</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Imagine you are an astronaut and have just completed your first spacewalk. Write a letter to your family back on earth explaining what it was like.</li><li>2) Write a newspaper report with the headline 'Aliens Invade Earth'.</li></ol>	
<p><b>Practise your times tables</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Write, cover, check</li><li>- Forwards, backwards, mixed up</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers</li></ul>	<p><b>Magnificent Maths</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Make a game for a Year 3 child so they can practise multiplication facts</li><li>2) Design a help sheet explaining two of the four calculation methods (i.e. addition and subtraction formal methods OR multiplication and division – grid method and bus-stop)</li></ol>	
<p><b>Learn spellings</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Look, say, cover, write, check</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Is there a spelling rule that helps?</li><li>- Identify the tricky part &amp; a way to remember it</li></ul> <p><i>Don't forget spelling tests are every <b>Friday</b></i></p>	<p><b>Super Science</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Try some astronomy! On a dark clear evening, go into your garden and look at the stars. What constellations can you see? How can you record what you have noticed?</li><li>2) Explain why this statement is wrong: "The sun travels across the sky."</li></ol>	
<p><b>Maths Games</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- See the links on the school website</li></ul>	<p><b>Poster Perfect</b> (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) To show a clever way of remembering the order of the planets in the Solar System</li><li>2) To encourage another child to try a new sport</li></ol>
