### Reading

### Number

- Count to and across to at least 20, forwards and backwards from any number
- Read and write numbers to 20 in numerals
- Write numbers in words to 10
- Identify "1 more" and "1 less" than any given number to at least 20.



### Phonics

- Learn the non-decodable words in your reading
- Word build using the sounds
- Spell words using the sounds

### Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Write the upper case letters of the alphabet (a-z) – use your neatest handwriting.
- 2) Write lists of rhyming words using set two sounds (from your Read Write Inc list, which is attached)

### Magnificent Maths (choose 1)

- 1) Look outside, what time does it get dark now? What time does it get light now? Does that change each week?
- 2) Go on a maths walk, count how many cars are parked on the road, or look at the numbers on the houses. How many other times can you see maths in our world?

### History

- 1) Take a photograph of you at a festival or celebration, record the date and where you are.

### Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)

- 1) Make us a picture using the wrong colours for instance, orange and purple trees!
- 2) Make us a bonfire or firework picture, you can choose what to use.
