Statement

The Sports Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools. The funding received by Loatlands Primary School has been used in a variety of ways in order to improve attainment and help overcome barriers to learning.

2016-17	£50 £50 £75	Wipe boards AfPE safety in PE hand book 2017 edition, rugby balls	<p>There are only teacher wipe boards fixed in the hall. We use these every lesson to deliver the learning objectives and success criteria. The children have the lesson explained and the goals written on the boards, during the lesson the children check their progress and then record their names by their final attainment. However this effective set up was lost when the lesson went outside. The purchase of just one wipe board has changed our outside lessons to match the quality in delivery and also helps the children to differentiate between a lesson outside and playtime.</p> <p>Our safety in PE book is used to support our MCLP health and safety in PE policy; many of the appendices are from this handbook. We have purchased the new edition. In order to inform/ update our teacher knowledge and therefore lower risks to staff and teachers during our lessons.</p> <p>Our sports coach has been leading Rugby sessions and the teachers asked for more balls so that they can continue with the sessions more effectively.</p>	<p>The board is wipe clean and uses pens already available in every classroom. The board is kept centrally so that everyone knows where to find it. It is light and easy to carry from one place to another.</p> <p>The AfPE handbook is only purchased when a new edition is available, this is not yearly. The knowledge base that the book gives our teachers is sustainable.</p> <p>The balls are good quality and will assist the coverage of Rugby for years to come. If I had not purchased the balls then the advantage of the coach training the teachers would have been lost.</p>
2016-17	£310	Staff uniform	<p>We have been promoting the health and wellbeing of our children through asking them to change into shorts and a t-shirt during PE and highlighting that this is for hygiene and so that they can exercise at full stretch. However the teachers also needed to feel that they were able to demonstrate moves effectively and to set an excellent example. So we have purchased a 'sports' t-shirt and hoodie for each teacher. They were used every PE lesson and are now faded.</p> <p>The uniform is always very well received with other member</p>

This really benefits our sports team look and feeling of togetherness when we are out of school at sporting events. 2016-17	£3666	<p>Set aside for the official MAT coach to assist the teachers in their teaching of games and REAL GYM. Each teacher to receive, 6x 45 minute sessions on a 1:1 basis.</p> <p>The cost also includes one after school club for the whole year.</p>	<p>Every teacher will be given the opportunity to both watch and team teach with a coach to enhance both their knowledge and confidence in games and gymnastics this year. Using the Cambridgeshire scheme of work that we purchased last academic year.</p> <p>Every class will be offered the opportunity to take part in an afterschool sports club free of charge run by the sports coach.</p> <p>The coach and the teachers are reporting a huge impact in their own teaching confidence and subject knowledge. The teachers are now engaging in lively, active lessons and the children are definitely knowledgeable with regards to personal goals during the lesson and have made good progress in self-assessment. I have conducted both staff and child questionnaires with regards to enjoyment, impact and achievement. The results are available on request.</p> <p>The coach has 20 children per club the clubs for this year are...Multi-skills, archery, young leader training, athletics, quick sticks and Dude perfect ball skills club</p>	<p>Obviously the coach herself is not a sustainable resource once the funding is dropped however, the invaluable 1:1 guidance she gives the teachers each year is sustainable as the teachers subsequently deliver the same scheme independently and the PE co-ordinator observes each teacher on yearly basis to identify where the money/ input is most needed.</p>
2016-17	4x90 £360	<p>To attend half termly MAT meetings at Montsaye Academy</p>	<p>Mat meetings have; developed an effective link to other coordinators in the cluster, as a team we have improved the Health and safety policy and have one corporate policy, which is being updated in 2017. We now have one corporate PE policy. We have a MAT inter-school sports competition and festival calendar. All cluster schools have purchased Real PE, the Cambridgeshire scheme of work and are sharing resources. As a school we hosted the cup stacking festival in September, we run the annual swimming gala and our sports leaders have been used as referees for the dodgeball festival at Montsaye this year. The medals are used for our competitions and stickers or certificates are given for our festivals. This is a hugely appreciated resource that allows the children to feel success in a measured way. They can mark and remember their achievements. They often show their medals in class on their return or in assembly, therefore inspiring others to volunteer or take up the challenge to be our Loatlands Gladiators.</p>	<p>This is not a sustainable spend. But the memories are sustainable and the whole school feeling of pride is also something that is invaluable.</p>

2016-17	£3480	Pacesetters sports coaching company to run our change4life club on a daily basis for 1 hour for four days a week.	<p>This is very popular. It is our goal at Loatlands to inspire the children to be independently health conscious and to foster a love of movement. These sessions are allowing the children to develop their vital movement skills in a nurturing environment. The children are timetabled for a certain time and day weekly that matches their age range. The club takes place at lunchtime to give a good model of what activities the children could be doing with the lunchtime resources which are provided elsewhere on the playground.</p> <p>I have conducted a children's questionnaire their comments for the adaptation of the sessions were actioned by Pacesetters and myself.</p>	<p>WE are in the process of training up our young leaders to take on some responsibility of games play during the lunch hour. This is directly from the success of our Pacesetters daily groups.</p> <p>The children are more active during lunchtime now and have more ideas of games to play so that they are not at a loss or looking to amuse themselves in a more disruptive manner.</p>

We transported children to the recent swimming gala, the dodgeball festival and will be transporting them to the tri-golf festival, athletics competition, orienteering and TATA kids of steel triathlon	This ensures that our efforts to allow EVERY CHILD to be given an equal opportunity to take part, is sustained. It is really important to us that the children go on to be active adults and that mindset is often generated by the experiences they receive during our extra-curricular events.
2016-17	£136	Gym training	<p>During this academic year Loatlands have been focusing on enhancing our gymnastics teaching and provision. We asked a specialist from Val Sabin organisation to deliver a day workshop for our co-ordinators which is then being fed through twilight sessions to our teaching staff. This will boost confidence and make the gymnastics sessions challenging.</p> <p>The confidence of the teachers has been enhanced alongside their enthusiasm to use apparatus and to develop independence in our children where before we were reticent to allow children to do certain moves or move certain equipment for the fear of the risk involved. The coach talked very much about keeping the children informed as to rules, and to allow them to move more for fitness and strength.</p>	The teachers have the Cambridgeshire scheme and now the knowledge to deliver good quality gymnastics to all children not just those who have a basic knowledge already from outside providers.

Future spending: - We are looking into paying towards the painting of our new playground. To match our healthy lifestyle ethos we would like to have a running track painted around the perimeter of the tarmac so that the children can run freely without worrying about knocking anyone over.
