Statement

The sports Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to. The funding received by Loatlands Primary School has been used in a variety of ways in order to improve attainment and help overcome barriers to learning.

2015-16	£355	Main cluster initiative is to purchase Cambridgeshire scheme of work.	We have been able to work more effectively in the more specific PE areas of Games, gymnastics and dance using this scheme. It has been used by three year groups already with measured success. The teachers have found the lesson plans to be simple, realistic and have been able to share the WALT and success criteria easily which of course matches our new ethos. During the next term our sports coach will focus on upskilling the teachers.
2015-16	£316	Whole MCLP cluster skipping event.	We wanted to do something that would impact all children in our MAT, so Loatlands organised for a skipping professional to coach the children at not only Loatlands but the whole cluster of schools. The children are now using skipping as a way to entertain themselves and to keep active during lunchtime play. One of our classes even worked for a whole half term perfecting tricks to share with parents.
2015-16	£3640	Set aside for the official MAT coach to assist the teachers in their teaching of games and REAL GYM. Each teacher to receive, 6x 45 minute sessions on a 1:1 basis. The cost also includes one after school club for the whole year.	Every teacher will be given the opportunity to both watch and team teach with a coach to enhance both their knowledge and confidence in games and gymnastics this year. Every class will be offered the opportunity to take part in an afterschool sports club free of charge. The coach and the teachers are reporting a huge impact in their own teaching confidence and subject knowledge. The teachers are now engaging in lively, active lessons and the children are definitely knowledgeable with regards to personal goals during the lesson and have made good progress in self-assessment. I have conducted both staff and child questionnaires with regards to enjoyment, impact and achievement. The results are available on request.
2015-16	£500	To attend half termly MAT meetings at Montsaye Academy	Mat meetings have; developed an effective link to other coordinators in the cluster, as a team we have improved the Health and safety policy and have one corporate policy. We now have one corporate PE policy. We have a MAT inter-school sports competition and festival calendar. All cluster schools have purchased Real PE, the Cambridgeshire scheme of work and are sharing resources. As a school we hosted the cup stacking festival in September, we run the annual swimming gala and our sports leaders have been used as referees for the dodgeball festival at Montsaye this year.

2015-16	£30	per school to be used as part of a cluster budget to purchase medals and certificates for our MAT competitions and festivals,	The allocation will be added to when needed.
2015-16	£3480	Pacesetters sports coaching company to run our change4life club on a daily basis for 1 hour for four days a week.	<p>This is very popular. It is our goal at Loatlands to inspire the children to be independently health conscious and to foster a love of movement. These sessions are allowing the children to develop their vital movement skills in a nurturing environment. The children are timetabled for a certain time and day weekly that matches their age range. The club takes place at lunchtime to give a good model of what activities the children could be doing with the lunchtime resources which are provided elsewhere on the playground. I have conducted a children's questionnaire their comments for the adaptation of the sessions where actioned by Pacesetters and myself. One of the sessions a week we specifically target PP children and those who are little reticent to join in in larger groups.</p> <p>We have also held lunchtime supervisor training during September and October 2015, this was a result of the conference in Kettering in April 2015. The staff were trained and assisted to deliver playground games.</p>
2015-16	£ 500	transport	To and from MAT and KSP events when cars are not appropriate because of child numbers. We transported children to the recent swimming gala, the dodgeball festival and will be transporting them to the tri-golf festival, athletics competition, orienteering and TATA kids of steel triathlon
		Possible mini bus training	So that we can hire the Marlow house community mini bus. WE are looking into this as a MAT cluster.
2015-16	£0	KSP school games package	We chose not to enter into this package this year. On reflection last year our £500 was spent on only a handful of children. We did achieve level 3 at a gymnastics event which was positive but we felt that our budget would be better spent with in the MAT and within our own school.
2015-16	£75	Tai-chi professional session	During this academic year Loatlands have been focusing on mindfulness and growth mind set. With that in mind we have developed an intervention activity based on Tai-chi. The children are taking part in daily calming bodily movements and breathing. They do this in between lessons and after playtimes. The impact is that after the session the children are calm and in the correct attitude to learn. We felt that we needed a professional to come in and show us an example of some real Tai-chi moves. The teachers were trained by taking part and felt confident to continue with our interventions because of the positivity that they could see the children were receiving from taking part. Three classes took part and we ran an after school session for parents and children. The children were amazed by the professional but also very proud of their own skill development. One class demonstrated our Loatlands moves to the professional!

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2016	£100	 <p>Football club set up</p>	<p>We closed our football team seven years ago and have not had a team in the school since then. This year we have been lucky enough to receive the help of two voluntary coaches so we are now offering a football club to boys and girls in upper key stage two. The children are even talking about taking part in friendly matches across the MCLP. Because we hadn't had a club for such a long time, we purchased resources to help with the training sessions that will be used solely for the club. We are looking into purchasing a new goal as we only have one.</p>
2016	£300	<p>Application for the AFPE Quality mark and supply for half a day out of the classroom to be with the validator</p>	<p>This quality mark is important because it is a robust and nationally recognised award. It will help us to be self-diagnostic and will celebrate the wonderful changes we have made to our PE provision over the last three years.</p>

Future spending :- We are looking into paying towards the painting of our new playground. To match our healthy lifestyle ethos we would like to have a running track painted around the perimeter of the tarmac so that the children can run freely without worrying about knocking anyone over.
