<b>Penny Sweets</b>		<b>Bigger Treats Term 5</b>	
<b><u>Reading</u></b> You can read: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book</li><li>- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections</li><li>- magazines, comics, newspapers</li><li>- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books</li></ul> <i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read. We will check Reading Records every Monday.</i>		<b><u>Wonderful Writing</u></b> (choose 1) <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Choose a top predator (i.e. wolf, lion, golden eagle, shark) and create a fact-file describing its characteristics; including how it hunts and what it hunts for.</li><li>2) Imagine that an animal has escaped from a local zoo! Write a newspaper report explaining how the animal escaped and what the public should do if they spot it!</li></ol>	
		<b><u>Magnificent Maths</u></b> (choose 1) <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Make a shopping board game where each player starts with the same amount of money (e.g. £10). When players land on a square they have to purchase whatever the square sells. You could have some bonus squares where your players could win extra money!</li></ol>	
		<b><u>Super Science</u></b> (choose 1) <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Draw your own food chain or food web for one of these habitats: forest, African savannah or ocean.</li><li>2) Make your own 'What Am I?' science quiz. Choose 5 different animals and write at least 3 clues for each animal, for example 'I live in the Arctic, I hunt seals, I hibernate in the winter. What am I?'</li></ol>	
<b><u>Practise your times tables</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Write, cover, check</li><li>- Forwards, backwards, mixed up</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers</li></ul>		<b><u>Poster Perfect</u></b> (choose 1) <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Explaining how to look after your teeth. Include top tips such as what food and drink to avoid and how to brush your teeth properly.</li><li>2) Encouraging people to put their litter in a bin. Make sure your poster includes details of the harm that litter can do to animals in the wild.</li></ol> <p>Make sure that your poster is colourful and eye-catching!</p>	
<b><u>Learn spellings</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Look, say, cover, write, check</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Is there a spelling rule that helps?</li><li>- Identify the tricky part &amp; a way to remember it</li></ul> <i>Don't forget spelling tests are every Thursday</i> <i>New spelling lists are given out every Friday</i>		<b><u>Amazing Arts and Crafts</u></b> (choose 1) <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Draw or paint your own animal portrait. You can choose any animal you like!</li><li>2) Make a bird feeder for your garden. You could make it from an empty milk carton. Decorate your bird feeder before filling it with seeds. Alternatively you could make your own fat balls to hang in the garden (there are recipes online).</li></ol>	
<b><u>Maths Games</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Try the games on <a href="http://ictgames.com">ictgames.com</a> or use your Purple Mash log-in to play Maths games on Purple Mash.</li></ul>		<p>Your 2 Bigger Treats must be completed and in school by <b>Monday 21<sup>st</sup> May</b> ready for our Class Exhibition.
