Reading You can read:


- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book

Bigger Treats Term 5

Wonderful Writing

- 1) Interview someone you know who has done something exciting and unusual, for example climbed a mountain.
- 2) Write a diary, imagining that you have explored somewhere no one has ever been. You can either go back in time and write as a real explorer or write in the present day, imagining you are investigating unexplored territory.

Super Science

- 1) Try growing a plant at home. Take photos, draw the different stages or keep a diary to explain the growing process.
- 2) Can cress be grown anywhere? Experiment with growing cress in different materials (i.e. cotton wool, tissue, fabric). Which material works best?

Magnificent Maths

- 1) Create your own maths eyes picture (either a drawing or taking photos) and think of a variety of questions for it.
- 2) Create a game that involves mental maths – make sure it challenges you! Focus on + - x ÷.
To really challenge yourself, include fractions, decimals and percentages.

Poster Perfect

Design a poster for any of these topics:

- 1) Investigate what is in your kitchen cupboards or the local supermarket and record where all of the items have come from. Try to use a map to show this.
- 2) Design a poster encouraging people to go and explore either somewhere nearby (e.g. a park) or a specific place in a different country, (e.g. a city or rainforest).

Amazing Arts and Crafts

- 1) What can you notice in nature? Either photograph or draw a selection of plants or animals that you can see at home or nearby. Focus on the details, for example the veins of a leaf.
- 2) Create art using materials you can find outside.
