<p>Reading You can read:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections- magazines, comics, newspapers- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books <p><i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read. We will check Reading Records every Monday.</i></p>		<p>Wonderful Writing (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Write a match report for a game that you have recently played in OR a game that you have enjoyed watching as a spectator (i.e. England V Belgium in the World Cup). Describe the highlights of the game. Who was your star player and why?2) Write a story where you are transported back in time! You could go back to the Victorian Era, to when the Romans invaded England or even to when dinosaurs walked the earth! Who or what do you meet when you are transported back in time? What exciting things happen?	
<p>Practise your times tables</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Write, cover, check- Forwards, backwards, mixed up- Ask someone to test you- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers		<p>Magnificent Maths (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make a leaflet explaining the properties of 2D shapes – how many sides, right angles, lines of symmetry does each shape have? Try to include different triangles and quadrilaterals i.e. equilateral triangle, square, trapezium.	
<p>Learn spellings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Look, say, cover, write, check- Ask someone to test you- Is there a spelling rule that helps?- Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it <p><i>Don't forget spelling tests are every Thursday</i> <i>New spelling lists are given out every Friday</i></p>		<p>Super Science (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) The Victorians were great inventors! Invent your own time-saving device i.e. a homework machine or a device for tidying your bedroom. Draw and label a diagram showing how your machine works.	
<p>Maths Games</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Try the games on ictgames.com or use your Purple Mash log-in to play Maths games on Purple Mash.		<p>Poster Perfect (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Comparing school in Victorian times to school today. What is different? (Children sat on individual tables in rows) What is the same? (Children learnt their times tables).2) Explaining how to keep 'sun-safe' when playing outside in the summer. <p>Make sure that your poster is colourful and eye-catching!</p>	
		<p>Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make your own toy that might have been played with in Victorian times – for example a peg doll, a kite or a spinning top.2) Postage stamps were first invented in Victorian times. Design your own set of 4 postage stamps. Choose a theme i.e. favourite animals, sportspeople, characters from a story or a game.	
<p>You have a Reading Record book and a Spelling Practise Book.
