Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing

- 1) Write a biography about a famous person that you admire.
- 2) Write a detailed diary entry as an evacuee of WW2 (include parenthesis, relative clauses, description, paragraphs etc.)

Magnificent Maths

- 1) Design a shop sale game which includes fractions of amounts. You will have the opportunity to play your game with some friends.
- 2) Create a booklet explaining how we add and subtract fractions (mixed number, improper fractions, adding more than two together).

Poster Perfect

Design a poster for any of these topics:

- 1) Design a poster exploring how to be happy and healthy.
- 2) Design a poster which shows forces used in everyday life. Try to include moving parts!

Super Science (choose 1)

- 1) Design a gas mask suitable for protecting during an air-raid. Explain why the materials you have chosen are suitable
- 2) Make a mini-dictionary for the terms to do with materials (e.g. changing state, heat, soluble, insoluble, reversible, irreversible etc.)

Amazing Arts and Crafts

- 1) 'Make do and mend' was very popular during WWII. Do some knitting or sewing – you could knit a simple bookmark or sew your own purse from recycled fabric!
- 2) Make your own simple toy that might have been played with during WWII – ideas could include a peg doll, a spinning top or a kite.
