
Sports Premium budget 2017-18

2017-18	£3600	Playground markings are a reality at last	<p>A quote from last year's budget...</p> <p>"Future spending :- We are looking into paying towards the painting of our new playground. To match our healthy lifestyle ethos we would like to have a running track painted around the perimeter of the tarmac so that the children can run freely without worrying about knocking anyone over.</p> <p>This is still a golden goal of ours and will perhaps look to source the monies from a grant or from the PTA."</p> <p>Please see photographs of the lines in use with in one day of completion!</p> <p>It was also advised to us during our Association for PE Quality mark award process that we move to use our budget to create playground markings.</p>	The guarantee is for 5 years
2017-18	£100	Staff uniform	<p>We have been promoting the health and wellbeing of our children through asking them to change into shorts and a t-shirt during pe and highlighting that this is for hygiene and so that they can exercise at full stretch. However the teachers also needed to feel that they were able to demonstrate moves effectively and to set an excellent example. So we have purchased a 'sports' t-shirt and hoodie for each teacher. They will supply the rest of their uniform which is black trousers and trainers. The outfit is identifiable in our school colours and has our logo embroidered on. This really benefits our sports team look and feeling of togetherness when we are out of school at sporting events. The higher percentage of children are also in full kit and we feel that this is because of the promotion from the teachers who wear their kit for every lesson.</p> <p>"Oh yes, Mrs Johnson has her red top on today so it must be PE!" child in Dahl</p>	<p>We last purchased a similar set of staff uniforms 2 years ago. They were used every PE lesson and are now faded.</p> <p>The uniform is always very well received with other member staff members even offering to buy themselves a kit.</p> <p>New staff need this uniform to look the same as the existing staff.</p>

2017-18	£3666	Set aside for the official MAT coach to assist the teachers in their teaching of games and REAL GYM. Each teacher to receive, 6x 45 minute sessions on a 1:1 basis. The cost also includes one after school club for the whole year.	Every teacher will be given the opportunity to both watch and team teach with a coach to enhance both their knowledge and confidence in games and gymnastics this year. Using the Cambridgeshire scheme of work that we purchased last academic year. Every class will be offered the opportunity to take part in an afterschool sports club free of charge run by the sports coach. The coach and the teachers are reporting a huge impact in their own teaching confidence and subject knowledge. The teachers are now engaging in lively, active lessons and the children are definitely knowledgeable with regards to personal goals during the lesson and have made good progress in self-assessment. I have conducted both staff and child questionnaires with regards to enjoyment, impact and achievement. The results are available on request. The coach has 20 children per club the clubs for this year are...Multi-skills, archery, young leader training, athletics, quick sticks and Dude perfect ball skills club	Obviously the coach herself is not a sustainable resource once the funding is dropped however, the invaluable 1:1 guidance she gives the teachers each year is sustainable as the teachers subsequently deliver the same scheme independently and the PE co-ordinator observes each teacher on yearly basis to identify where the money/ input is most needed.
2017-18	5x90 £450	To attend half termly MAT meetings at Montsaye Academy	Mat meetings have; developed an effective link to other coordinators in the cluster, as a team we have improved the Health and safety policy and have one corporate policy, which is being updated in 2017. We now have one corporate PE policy. We have a MAT inter-school sports competition and festival calendar. All cluster schools have purchased Real PE, the Cambridgeshire scheme of work and are sharing resources. As a school we hosted the cup stacking festival in September, we run the annual swimming gala and our sports leaders have been used as referees for the dodgeball festival at Montsaye this year. We are also heading up a new exciting festival for our G+T children, which is based on tennis skills.	This group are now in their fifth year of embedded organisation.
2017-18	£30	per school to be used as part of a cluster budget to purchase medals and certificates for our MAT competitions and festivals,	The allocation will be added to when needed. The medals are used for our competitions and stickers or certificates are given for our festivals. This is a hugely appreciated resource that allows the children to feel success in a measured way. They can mark and remember their achievements. They often show their medals in class on their return or in assembly, therefore inspiring others to volunteer or take up the challenge to be our Loatlands Gladiators.	This is not a sustainable spend. But the memories are sustainable and the whole school feeling of pride is also something that is invaluable.
2017-18	£3480	Pacesetters sports coaching company to run our change4life club on a daily basis for 1 hour for four days a week.	This is very popular. It is our goal at Loatlands to inspire the children to be independently health conscious and to foster a love of movement. These sessions are allowing the children to develop their vital movement skills in a nurturing environment. The children are timetabled for a certain time and day weekly that matches their age range. The club takes place at lunchtime to give a good model of what activities the children could be doing with the lunchtime resources which are provided elsewhere on the playground. 2017-18	£ 750	transport	To and from MAT and KSP events when cars are not appropriate because of child numbers. We transported children to the recent swimming gala, the dodgeball festival and will be transporting them to the tri-golf festival, athletics competition, orienteering and TATA kids of steel triathlon	This ensures that our efforts to allow EVERY CHILD to be given an equal opportunity to take part, is sustained. It is really important to us that the children go on to be active adults and that Mindset is often generated by the experiences they receive during our extra-curricular events.
2017-18	£1200, (Level 2 teaching is £640)	Swim teachers training	<p>During this academic year Loatlands have been focusing on enhancing our swimming teaching and provision. We asked a specialist the Institute of swimming organisation to deliver a day workshop for our co-ordinators/ junior staff across the MAT which is then being fed through power points and individual discussions to our teaching staff. This will boost confidence and make the swimming sessions focused to need and of course more challenging, the teachers will be able to look more at skill acquisition through play and stroke techniques.</p> <p>We are looking to provide our own in house swimming teacher qualified to level 2 standard. This will allow for much better effective communication, sharper lesson objectives and in house advice. The sports coordinator will be trained over an 8 day officially recognised award qualification run by IoS.</p>	Because the level 2 teacher will be monitoring the swimming lessons and team teaching with the other teachers the money outlay will be sustained in the up levelling of skills and the transferability of the knowledge to others year on year.
2017-18	£827	Bespoke outdoor storage.	After a safety walk around the area looking at PE specifically. It came to our attention that due to overcrowding in our existing outdoor storage facility teachers were not able to access the correct resources for outdoor games. This resulted in either the lessons being completed indoors with inappropriate resources or outdoors with the same inappropriate resources. Eg blown up soft balls for football	This building is a sustainable addition to our area as it will be brick built. The difference it makes to our provision of high quality well-resourced lessons is also sustainable.

			<p>because the leather footballs were unobtainable behind the schools staging.</p> <p>It is proposed that our site supervisor builds a substantial brick building to house our outdoor PE equipment and lunchtime play resources that is easily accessible to the children and teachers alike.</p>	
2017-18	£4000	Forest school set up and training of one member of staff.	<p>We have been lucky enough to receive help and monies from Tesco, during the summer they cleared our outdoor pond area and we have plans to make this a calming aspirational peace garden. We also want to train a teacher to set up and run a forest school area attached to this development and therefore we have set aside a substantial amount of PE budget to allow this to be initiated.</p> <p>It was also advised to us during our Association for PE Quality mark award process that we move to use our budget to create a Forest school area.</p>	With the member of staff being trained to the correct level with a recognised forest schools award we can guarantee sustainability.
2017-18	£149	Fitness campaign, RUN THE WORLD	<p>We are continually searching for new incentives to drive our children's interest and inspire new participants.</p> <p>A team of Loatlands staff have formed a running club, called the Loatlands legends we are attempting to virtually run the length of England, stopping at places of interest. Recording each Km we achieve on a board in our visual sports board area in the library. We have challenged the whole school to join us. The children can apply for a running log to record running out of school and the official cross country club who are 35 strong this year are each running at least 1km each week at the club to add to our total. After we virtually arrive at Dover we intend to ask the children to choose our next country to run across, one that has poignancy for our children who have family abroad. Ad a reward for their hard work we would like to purchase medals to those children who run a certain distance each week at the club and those who can prove they have run each week out of school. So we have decided to leave some of our budget free for the purchase of medals</p>	This is our attempt to change the view of fitness in children and adults as a 'long term life choice. We would hope that this is a plan for sustainability.
