
We also enjoyed learning about volcanoes and how they are formed. Some were particularly explosive!

The class whose turn it is will then make their way to the library after the register and meet you there for the 'stay and read' session. We hope you are able to join your child for their 'stay and read' session. If the sessions prove popular then we will continue them after February half-term.

### Change of School Holidays proposal

As you know this school is part of a multi academy trust (MAT) consisting of Montsaye Academy, Rothwell Junior School, Rothwell Victoria Infant School, Loatlands Primary School, Havelock Junior School, Havelock Infant School, Wilbarston C of E Primary School and Rushton Primary School.

You may well have been contacted recently by Sharon Short Marketing – as we are currently carrying out a consultation process amongst staff, parents and pupils to fully understand what makes our MAT attractive to pupils, parents and staff. We are expecting our new marketing strategy to be ready to launch early in February 2019 – we will keep you updated via school newsletters.

We are currently consulting on changing the length of the Summer holiday and October half term and we need your views in order to inform the decision. The proposal is to make the Summer holidays 1 week shorter by reducing days at the beginning and end and to make the October half term 2 weeks instead of 1 week. 
