Nursery News

We have had a lovely week sharing photos and stories from when the children were babies and looking at how they have changed and developed. Thank you to all the parents for sending in photos, the children have really enjoyed sharing them with their friends.

This week we have two signs of the week 'yesterday' and 'tomorrow' which have supported us when recalling events that happened yesterday and talking about those that have not happened yet.

Two of the key skills we wish to develop in nursery are resilience and creativity. If a child leaves nursery with the ability to keep trying and not give up, whilst trying different ways to fulfil their goals, they will be very successful during their school years. A group of children demonstrated those characteristics in abundance this week when they designed and made their own costumes. The ideas were all their own and they had minimal adult support, we think they might be the fashion designers of the future!

How can you help at home?

Talk to your child and share photos of things that have happened in the past, encourage your child to recall a special family occasion or a funny memory. Talking about events in the correct order is an important early reading skill.

Borrow a book from our library as often as you wish, no need to record anything, when you have finished with it just return it and swap it for another.
