School Reports

As usual, we are currently compiling your child's annual report and this will be provided on Monday 6th July 2020. If your child is in school we will send it home with them (along with reports for any siblings who are not in school). Alternatively, you can collect your child's report at the following times **during the day on Monday 6th July**:

If your surname begins with the letters A – E: between 9:30am and 10:30am

If your surname begins with the letters F – J: between 10:30am and 11:30am

If your surname begins with the letters K – O: between 11:30am and 12:30pm

If your surname begins with the letters P – T: between 12:30pm and 1:30pm

If your surname begins with the letters T – Z: between 1:30pm and 2:30pm

A desk will be set up outside the main entrance for you to collect the reports. Please note that you will only be able to collect reports for those children that you have parental responsibility for (e.g. a friend / childminder cannot collect the reports on your behalf). Please remember to follow social distancing guidelines while on our school site. (We understand that the government plans to relax social distancing guidelines from 4th July but would respectfully ask that you continue to follow the 2m guide in order to keep everyone safe.)

If you are unable to collect your child's report, please do not worry any that have not been collected by 2:30pm will be posted to your home address instead.

As usual, reports will contain details of who your child's class teacher will be next year. Over the final few weeks of term your child will receive some tasks to do as part of their home learning to tell their new teacher all about themselves, a short message from their current teacher to say goodbye and a message from their new teacher to welcome them.

Ordering Back To School Uniform

Due to the social distancing measures that will be in place in our warehouse which may affect the volume of orders we can process at any one time, we strongly urge schools and parents requiring uniform for September to order as soon as possible.

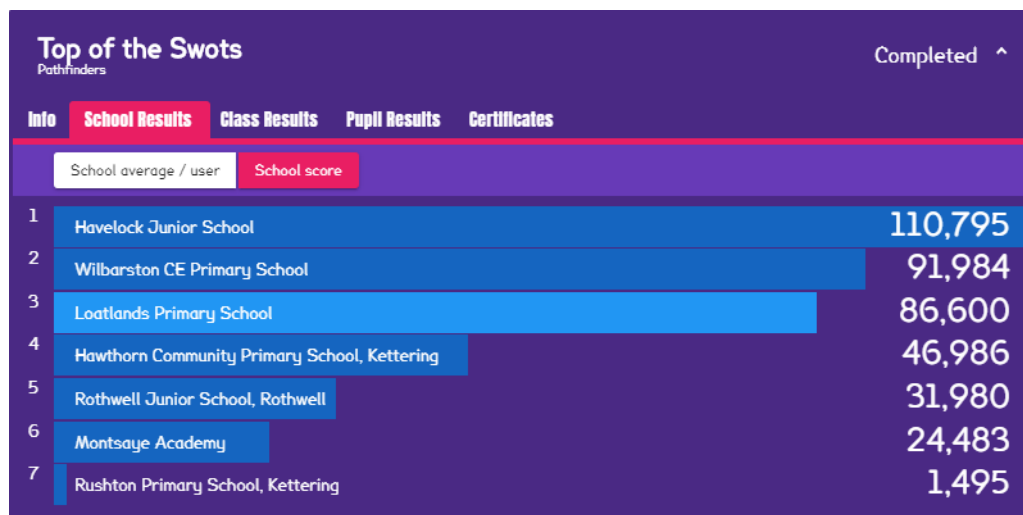

Please can we ask that all children in school and Nursery have a sun hat with them everyday and have sun cream applied before school when necessary.

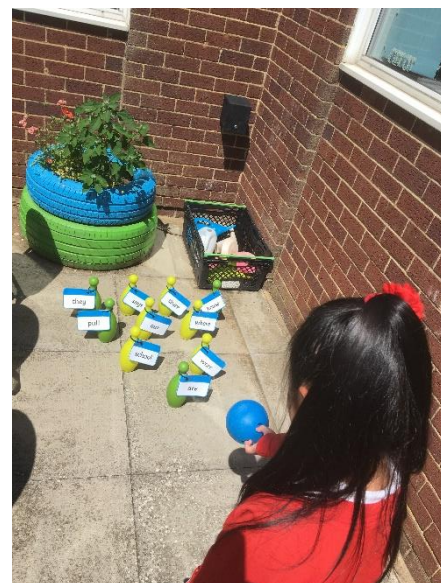
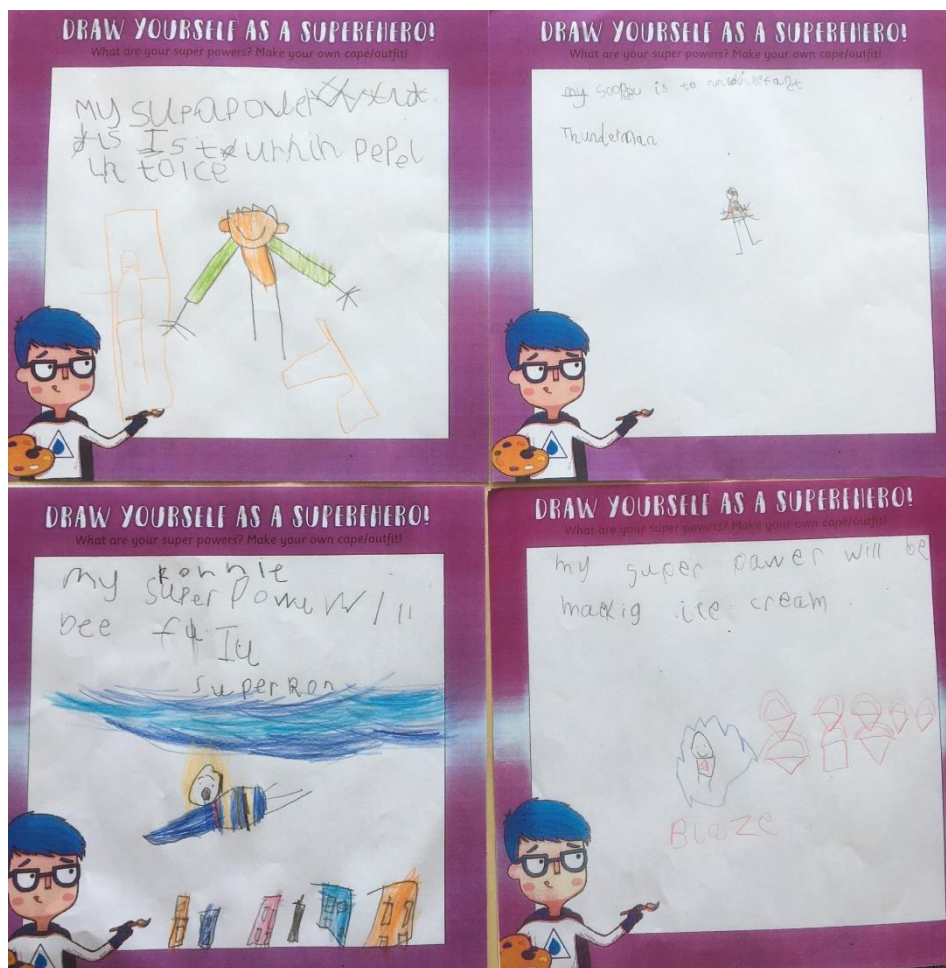
Bubble News

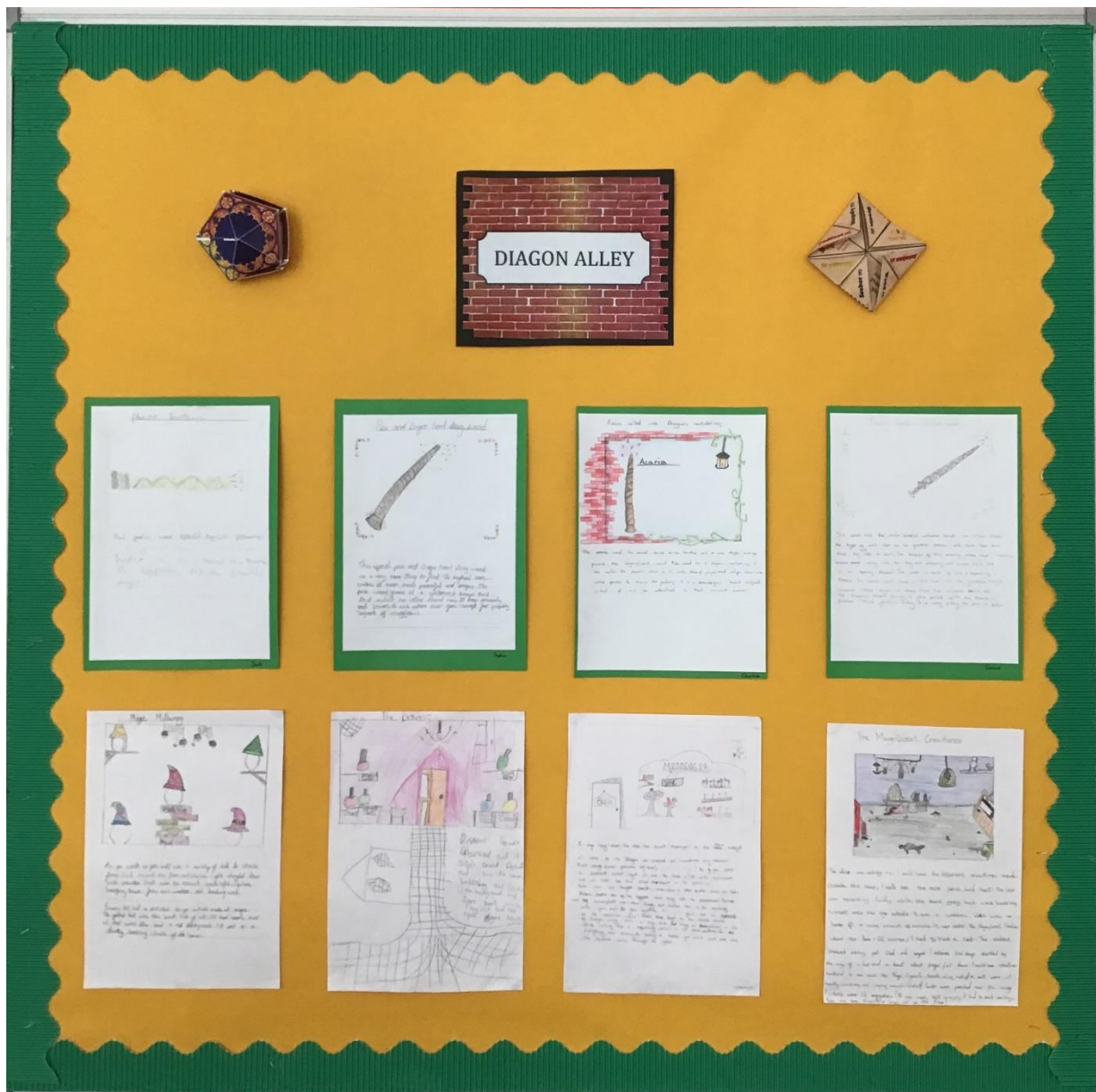
