Reading You can read:


- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book

Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Write a story where you are magically transported back to an Anglo-Saxon village.
- 2) Write a diary entry imagining you have found an important Anglo-Saxon artefact in your back garden. What have you found and what happens next?

Magnificent Maths (choose 1)

- 1) Invent your own maths game that includes multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.
- 2) Create your own 'pairs' card game where the players have to match equivalent fractions.

Fantastic Forces (choose 1)

- 1) Explain how the different moving parts of your bike work – gears, brakes, wheels
- 2) Experiment with making parachutes for one of your toys (i.e. a lego person). Which parachute works best? How can you find out?

Poster Perfect (choose 1)

Design a poster for any of these topics:

- 1) to explain place value in numbers up to either: a thousand, ten thousand or a million
- 2) to help younger children when they are choosing a book to read from the school library

Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)

- 1) Design and make an Anglo-Saxon weapon (i.e. sword or shield).
- 2) The Anglo-Saxons often made friendship bracelets to give to friends. Make your own friendship bracelet using thread or wool.
