
Reading

You can read:
- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book
- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections
- magazines, comics, newspapers
- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books
*Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read so that you can claim your House Points. We will check Reading Records every **Monday**.*



Practise your 3 times tables.

- Counting in 3's forwards.
- 3 times table games on the internet.
- Listen to 3 times table songs.
- Roll a dice/chose a number to 6 and multiply by 3.
Challenge: choose a number to 12.



Learn spellings

- Look, say, cover, write, check
- Ask someone to test you
- Is there a spelling rule that helps?
- Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it


Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Choose your favourite character from a book or film and write a character description. Can you use exciting vocabulary and expanded noun phrases. What do they look like? What do they do? What type of person are they? *E.g. Horrid Henry is a boy who likes to play harmless tricks on his friends. He carefully plans his awful tricks.*
Challenge: use suffixes – words ending in ful, ness, ly, ment or less
- 2) Write sentences using the Y2 Common Exception words (they are on the back of your reading record).
Challenge: use conjunctions to join your ideas (or, and, but, because, when, if, that, so, then, after, also)

Magnificent maths (choose 1)

- 1) Make amounts using coins – how many ways can you make 25p, 79p or £1 and 73p.
- 2) Giving change from 20p– make some money labels and play shop, work out change by finding the difference. E.g. I bought some sweets for 11p and I paid with 20p. What is the difference between 20 and 11? Solve using pictures or by counting back on a number line.
Challenge: give change from amounts up to 50p then any amount up to £1



Super Science

- 1) Investigate the suitability of materials. Predict which material would be the most suitable to make a waterproof coat for Paddington and then test the materials. Which material would make a good waterproof coat and why? Was your prediction correct? List you materials, write your prediction and then write your results.



Poster Perfect

- 1) Design a poster about the features of a non-fiction book. Choose a non-fiction reading or library book to help.
Challenge: can you add examples?

Amazing Arts and Crafts

- 1) Create your own colourful art using a ruler. Here are some examples.
