Write a fact-file or short biography based on their experiences.2) Write a short newspaper report announcing the start of WWII. <p><u>Magnificent Maths</u> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make a board game or a card game involving equivalent fractions, e.g. $1/2 = 2/4$ and $3/6$2) Make your own colourful repeating pattern using different shapes that could be used as wrapping paper. <p><u>Super Science</u> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Design a hat suitable for protecting someone in the Home Guard during an air-raid. Explain why the materials you have chosen are suitable.2) Explore the difference between melting and dissolving using materials you can find in your kitchen. <p><u>Poster Perfect</u> (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Design a poster explaining the features of some of the fighter planes used in the Battle of Britain.2) Design a poster explaining what 'respect' means in our school. <p><u>Amazing Arts and Crafts</u> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make a model of an Anderson shelter.2) Make a dish following a WWII recipe for your family to try. Take photos to show the different steps you followed. What did your family think?
