Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Write a story where you are magically transported back to the time of King Arthur's ruling.

Magnificent Maths (choose 1)

Design a poster for any of these topics:

- 1) to explain place value in numbers up to a million
- 2) to help younger children when they are choosing a book to read from the school library
- 3) to explain how the Tudors dressed (both the rich and the poor)

Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)

- 1) Design and make a Tudor coat of arms
- 2) The Tudors are often associated with the Tudor Rose. Make your own using any material you wish.
