<p>Reading You can read:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections- magazines, comics, newspapers- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books <p><i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read. We will check Reading Records every Monday.</i></p>	<p>Wonderful Writing (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Imagine that a new tomb has just been discovered in Egypt! Write a newspaper report about the exciting discovery. What is inside the tomb? Who discovered it? Is there a curse? Your report should be no more than a page long.2) Write a story set in the Sahara desert. Maybe your character could get lost in a sand storm? How will your character escape from the desert? Your story should be 1 to 2 pages long.	
<p>Practise your times tables</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Write, cover, check- Forwards, backwards, mixed up- Ask someone to test you- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers	<p>Magnificent Maths (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) You have £50 to spend on Christmas presents for friends and family. Prepare a shopping list showing how you are going to spend the money. Don't go over budget!2) Make your own Christmas gift box! It can be any 3D shape you like. Make sure that is beautifully decorated.	
<p>Learn spellings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Look, say, cover, write, check- Ask someone to test you- Is there a spelling rule that helps?- Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it <p><i>Don't forget spelling tests are every Thursday</i> <i>New spelling lists are given out every Friday</i></p>	<p>Super Science (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make your own musical instrument – i.e. a drum, a shaker or a mini 'guitar'. Think about how your musical instrument creates sound.2) Design a mini leaflet explaining how our ears work. How do we hear sound?	
<p>Maths Games</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Try the games on ictgames.com or use your Purple Mash log-in to play Maths games on Purple Mash.	<p>Poster Perfect (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) to advertise the Christmas Tree Festival at St Giles Church2) to advertise a trip to Egypt. Think about all the places that a visitor could explore – the Pyramids of Giza, the Valley of the Kings or a River Nile cruise. <p>Make sure that your poster is colourful and eye-catching!</p>	
<p>You have a Reading Record book and a Spelling Practise Book. Miss Heald and Mrs Dearing will collect these books in regularly this term to check that you are completing your Penny Sweets homework.</p>	<p>Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Make a piece of jewellery for an Ancient Egyptian King or Queen. You could make a bracelet or a necklace from beads or painted pasta (use lots of red, gold and blue).2) Make a model sarcophagus (tomb). You could use a shoebox and decorate it with paintings of Egyptian gods and goddesses or hieroglyphs!
