<p><b>Reading</b> You can read:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book</li><li>- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections</li><li>- magazines, comics, newspapers</li><li>- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books</li></ul> <p><i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read so that you can claim your Reading Raffle Ticket.</i></p>	<p><b>Wonderful Writing</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Carry out research about someone who was alive during WWII. Write a fact-file or short biography based on their experiences.</li><li>2) Write a short newspaper report announcing the start of WWII.</li></ol>	
<p><b>Practise your times tables</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Write, cover, check</li><li>- Forwards, backwards, mixed up</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers</li></ul>	<p><b>Magnificent Maths</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Looking at Maths in real-life, can you find examples of fractions within your home or outside. Take photos and create a poster showcasing the fractions that you have found.</li><li>2) Create a step-by-step instruction booklet on how to multiply and divide different numbers, using your knowledge from lessons within class to help!</li></ol>

Explain why the materials you have chosen are suitable.</li><li>2) Make a mini-dictionary for the terms to do with forces (e.g. gravity, air resistance, up thrust, friction)</li></ol>	
<p><b>Maths Games</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- See the links on the school website</li></ul>	<p><b>Poster Perfect</b> (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Design a poster explaining the features of some of the fighter planes used in the Battle of Britain.</li><li>2) Design a poster to teach children within the younger year groups about how to tie their shoe laces.</li></ol>
