Reading

Children are continuing to make great progress with their reading. We ask that children read daily with an adult at home as this helps to develop fluency. Please remember to record this in children's reading records as they are always so eager to share this with us.

Every Friday, your child will bring home new spellings to learn. Please practise these for 5 minutes a day.

We will continue our focus on the 'common exception words'. Children have been working hard on these and are starting to apply them in all written work now. By the end of Year 2 children should be secure on all Year 1 & 2 common exception words.

We would also like the children to play Times Table Rockstars at home as well as Numbots, at least once a week. You will find all the login details in your child's reading record. During this term, we will be learning about our topic of 'India'. We will look at the human and physical geography of the country, learn an Indian dance and compare the county to England.

Our maths units this term are statistics and calculations.

In Science, we will be looking at

animals including humans, the lifecycle of a butterfly and living processes.

In RE, we will be learning about Islam, community and belonging.
