Online Safety

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Childnet have updated their parent and carer toolkit that will help parents have conversations about online
 ★ safety. Their booklet 'Let's talk about life online' includes ten key messages that should be shared with
 ★ children:

- 1. "You can always come to me if you need help."
- 2. "What would you do if this happened...?"
- 3. "Remember that not everyone is who they say they are online."
- 4. "Keep your personal information safe, and other people's too."
- 5. "Be respectful to others online."
- 6. "Think before you post."
- 7. "Remember to ask if it's okay."
- "Remember not everything is true online."
- 9. "The things other people post online might not always show what their life is really like."
- 10. "Recognise how going online makes you feel and take a break when you need to."
