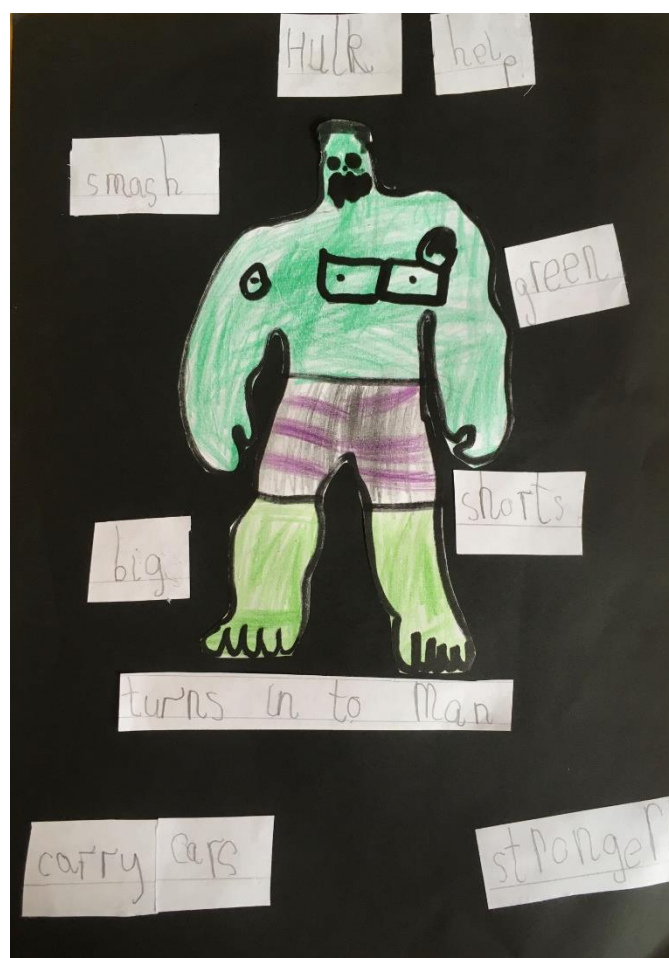
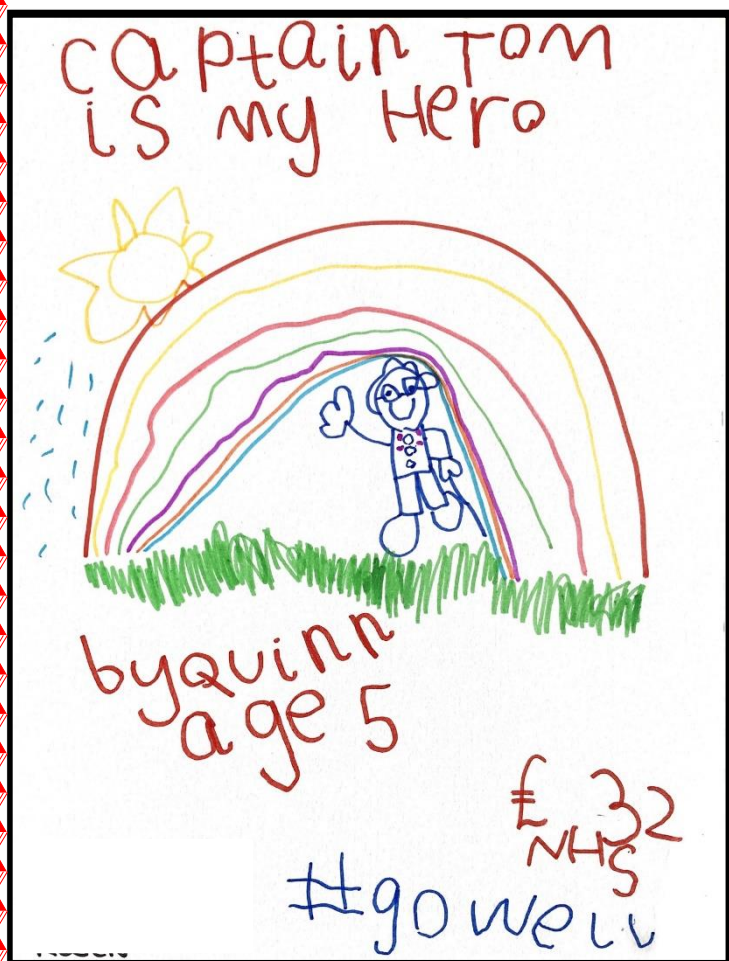
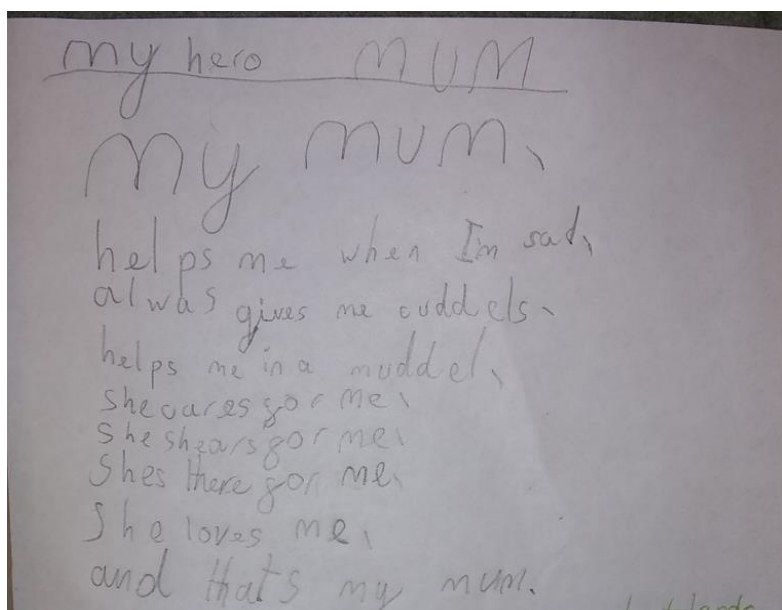
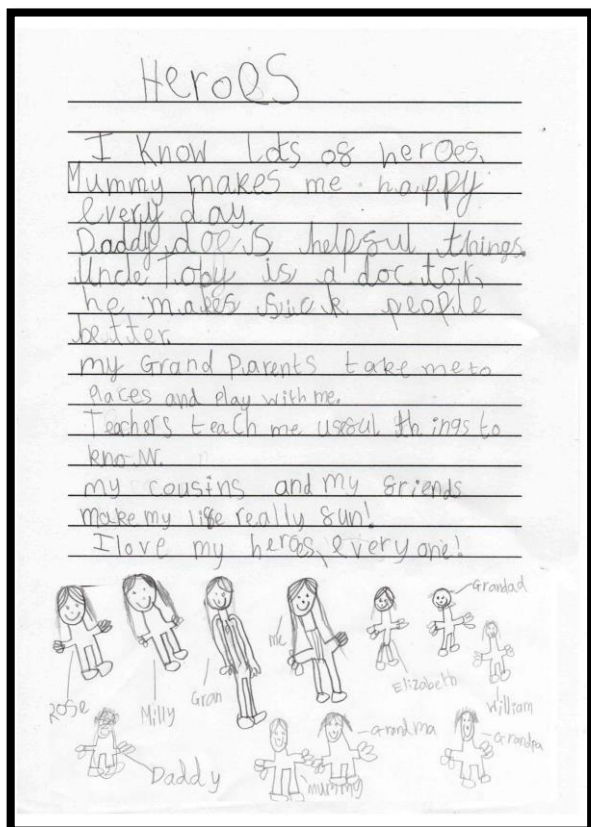
New accident reporting system
