<p><b>Reading</b> You can read:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book</li><li>- Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections</li><li>- magazines, comics, newspapers</li><li>- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books</li></ul> <p><i>Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read. We will check Reading Records every Monday.</i></p>	<p><b>Wonderful Writing</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Imagine you are working as a servant in a rich Victorian household. Write a letter to your family telling them about a typical day at work.</li><li>2) Write a mini fact file about Florence Nightingale. She was a famous nurse who saved many soldier's lives during the Crimean war (1853-1856).</li></ol>	
<p><b>Practise your times tables</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Write, cover, check</li><li>- Forwards, backwards, mixed up</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers</li></ul>	<p><b>Magnificent Maths</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Make a leaflet about measures. Find things at home that are measured in grams, kilograms, millilitres and litres. Draw and label the items with the correct measurement.</li><li>2) Make a board or card game for children to practise using money and converting from pounds to pence.</li></ol>	
<p><b>Learn spellings</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Look, say, cover, write, check</li><li>- Ask someone to test you</li><li>- Is there a spelling rule that helps?</li><li>- Identify the tricky part &amp; a way to remember it</li></ul> <p><i>Don't forget spelling tests are every Thursday</i> <i>New spelling lists are given out every Friday</i></p>	<p><b>Super Science</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Design a mini leaflet explaining the dangers of Electricity.</li></ol>	
<p><b>Maths Games</b></p> <p>-Try the games on <a href="http://ictgames.com">ictgames.com</a> or use your Purple Mash log-in to play Maths games on Purple Mash.</p>	<p><b>Poster Perfect</b> (choose 1)</p> <p>Design a poster for any of these topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Write a set of school rules that would be suitable for a 'Victorian classroom'. Include some illustrations to show what a Victorian classroom would look like.</li><li>2) In Victorian times, forms of public transport changed dramatically. Design a poster to advertise the first successful car, the first underground train or bicycle.</li></ol> <p>Make sure that your poster is colourful and eye-catching!</p>	
<p>You have a Reading Record book and a Spelling Practise Book. Your teacher will collect these books in regularly this term to check that you are completing your Penny Sweets homework.</p>	<p><b>Amazing Arts and Crafts</b> (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) The Victorians loved paintings that told a story. Paint a scene of something from the Victorian era that tells a story. It could show the types of houses rich and poor people lived in.</li><li>2) William Morris was a famous designer from the Victorian times. Today, he is best known for his designs for curtains and wallpaper. Make a collage of as many different William Morris designs as you can find.</li></ol>
