Reading

You can read:

- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book
 - Other Fiction books, short stories, poetry collections
 - magazines, comics, newspapers
 - Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books
- Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read so that you can claim your House Points. We will check Reading Records every **Monday**. **Read at least 4 times a week to get a StarBooks sticker.***



Practise your 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.

- Counting in 2s, 3s, 5s & 10s forwards and backwards
- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers e.g. 2 x 5 =



Learn spellings

- Look, say, cover, write, check
 - Ask someone to test you
 - Is there a spelling rule that helps?
 - Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it
- Practise your weekly spellings on [Spelling shed](#).*



Maths Games

- Use your logins in the front of your reading record to practise your times tables and addition/subtraction on [Numbots](#) and [TT Rockstars](#).
- Practise counting on from any number up to 100.
- Choose 5 numbers between 1-100 and put them in order from smallest to greatest and then greatest to smallest.
- Practise your counting to 100 [Count to 100 song](#)

Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Write an adventure story with a beginning, middle and end on the theme of the dark or fireworks. Try to use lots of exciting vocabulary and expanded noun phrases e.g. High in the pitch black sky, vivid colours erupt like a volcano to light up the night. Quivering with excitement the shy little boy lets out a squeal of joy and grabs his grown-up's hand. **Challenge:** Can you write a full page of A4.
- 2) Create a poem based on the theme of the dark. You could create an acrostic poem or a poem using the senses or repetition i.e. the dark is lonely, the dark is fun, the dark is an adventure waiting to be explored.

Magnificent maths (choose 1)

- 1) Look at a range of British coins and notes and order them from smallest to greatest value. Use the coins to make 20p and 50p. How many different ways can you make the amounts?
- 2) Find a range of objects in the home and use them to make groups of 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.



Super Science

- 1) Go for a walk with your adult, record any signs of autumn that you spot. Think about the use of your senses and the sights, sounds, smells & textures you encounter. Can you record your observations in a creative way? May be you could create a poem, poster or photo collage to show your findings.

Poster Perfect

- 1) Design a wanted poster for Guy Fawkes, remember to include a brief description using a range of adjectives and the correct punctuation.
- 2) Create a poster to show the months and celebrations that occur in each season.

Amazing Arts and Crafts (Choose 1)

- 1) Create a picture or collage using a range of natural materials found in your garden such as twigs, leaves, conkers etc.
- 2) Make your own Guy to represent Guy Fawkes.
